

FROM YOUR PASTOR

A "2020" Kind of Christmas

After all the effort in trying to get back to "normal" before the end of the year, it appears that things will not be going back to normal yet. We are discussing the dangers of gathering, the unsanitary conditions of sharing meals together, the cancellations of parades, Christmas parties, and concerts, and the final rising problem of the season, the debates within our families of what should be done and what shouldn't be done causing more division. As I always say, a pandemic sometimes intensifies problems that were already there. And on top of that, from my observation, many families strangely have gone through more trials this year than any other year; economic struggles, health, relationships and deaths. Whatever the reason, it's all set up for another tag line: "Christmas just won't be the same this year." Is 2020 going to be known as a "disappointing Christmas?"

Somehow, the glow of Christmas lights, the tune of Christmas carols, the Christmas specials on TV or our very own family traditions will not be able fix the year 2020. "Sleep in heavenly peace" is a phrase of a song that we may sing but that we do not get to live. It is so easy for it to be "a disappointing Christmas."

And yet, the beauty of Christmas is that Christ our Savior's coming does not depend on everything going as we hoped it would. Actually, He came from heaven because everything was going wrong here on earth. Years like 2020 were the reason for the first Christmas. He came because we were disappointed, disenfranchised, disfigured, dismembered and disheveled in our worry, our despair and our old sin. And yet, Christ still comes, regardless of our disarray, to make an appointment with us in His house where we may receive and share His gifts by the power and grace of His Holy Spirit. Christmas is not about getting things right or "normal"; it is about God who came to make things right for us. Christmas is not about making ourselves happy; it is about God who came in the flesh to bring us joy. Christmas is not about having things our way; it is about God in Christ Jesus being the Way, the Truth and the Life for us so that we are brought into His way that leads to true hope and peace.

Disappointed in these upcoming Twelve Days of Christmas? Perhaps because you have "dissed your appointment"—Your Heavenly Appointment! Perhaps it is the right time that you "fall on your knees and hear the angels' voices" as God Himself comes to you in His Holy Word, confessing your sin and receiving absolution, gathering with the Saints around the Table of the Lord and ponder the gift that you eat and drink, praying that our Lord would stir you to a greater appreciation for His death and resurrection for your salvation as you wait for His return. Maybe it is finally time to spend more time with God who became flesh and dwelt among us as truly wise people continue to seek Him. Maybe your disappointment is God's way of reshaping our priorities in life and showing you that Christmas is not about your feelings and expectations as much as it is about God's love for you that is never-changing. His return in the near future, the rest of 2020 and beyond, reorders our present day priorities while helping us learn from our past in a healthy, constructive, Christ-forgiven way and to better look forward to a future that God has prepared for His people.

God so loved the world that He graciously sent His only begotten Son that whoever believes in Him would not perish but would have everlasting life...and that perfect, joyful, peaceful life is put inside you EVERY Christmas.

From Your Congregational President

Dear Members,

Joy to the World, the Savior reigns!

As we near the end of 2020, these are comforting words which remind us of who is actually in charge. We know that no matter what the adversity is that we face, the Savior reigns!

Grace is blessed to be open, serving God's people and announcing Joy to the World, the Lord is Come!, through our various ministries.

To help improve the delivery of God's Word within our sanctuary and online we have installed a new sound system this week. This will not only enhance the service for all, it will offer a new way of listening for those with hearing impairments. We will have four headphones available for those who may benefit from a more concentrated sound. Also, those who have hearing aids can connect to Bluetooth and we will be able to stream to your hearing aids.

I announced earlier this month the plans for temperature checks, masks and social distancing. Those plans are as follows:

- 1) *Temperature Checks* Effective immediately we are suspending temperature checks at the door prior to services. The exception to this policy change will be that Pastor Miller and anyone working the service (i.e. Elders, Ushers, etc.) will continue to be required to have temperature checks.
- 2) Masks Per Gov. Ivey's mask order, we will continue to require masks be worn through December 11, 2020 at which time the Governor may extend or rescind the order. As always, we will follow our government official's guidance as good Christians and good Citizens. In the event Gov. Ivey was to rescind the mask order on or before December 11, 2020 we would then remove the mask requirement but continue to highly recommend the wearing of masks during services for the protection of all members. Again, the exception to that change would be Pastor Miller and anyone working the service.
- 3) Social Distancing While Gov. Ivey's order has modified the occupancy levels for various commercial businesses the Council has decided that Grace will maintain the current service attendance levels and physical separation plan that we currently have in place. While it is good to see our fellow members and friends at church and we wish to socialize with them, we cannot have a grouping of people at the back of the church or in the aisles prior to services as this defeats social distancing. We therefore want to remind everyone that once you enter the sanctuary you should proceed to your pew. If you wish to speak to one another, please wait until after you have exited the sanctuary following the service.

We look forward to seeing you at our Advent and Christmas Eve services. On behalf of Pastor Miller and the Church Council I want to wish each of you a Merry Christmas as you enjoy time with family and friends.



CHARLES DICKENS' A CHRISTMAS CAROL




Grace is gifting you the full Dickens' novel accompanied with a 4-week bible study and daily devotions for everyday leading us to Christmas.

Wednesdays @ 7:00 pm with a hymn/carol sing at 6:45 Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol: What Happens When Jesus Comes?

No story illustrates transformation better than Dickens' classic Christmas story of Ebenezer Scrooge - a miserable miser who shortchanges those who work for him, is ruthless to those who owe him money, is coldly indifferent to the pleas of widows and orphans, and has not one charitable bone in his curmudgeonly old body. Dickens says this of Scrooge: Oh, but he was a tight-fisted hand at the grindstone, Scrooge! A squeezing, wrenching, grasping, scraping, clutching, covetous old sinner! As we know, all that is about to change one Christmas Eve, as Scrooge is visited by three ghosts - the ghosts of Christmas past, present, and future, and he is led on an incredible journey of redemption and transformation. And we get to join him on his journey because we will have the opportunity to be visited by the three ghosts here at Grace! In case you didn't know it, this tale was based on the five major scripture passages of Advent, to help Christians prepare for the coming of Christ, when their lives were in need of repentance and redemption.

Every service begins with a Christmas Carol/Hymn Sing at 6:45 PM. You get to pick the Advent, Christmas or Epiphany hymns out of our hymnal!

Wednesday, December 2: 7 PM - Haunted by the Past? How the Coming of Jesus Redeems your Past

Wednesday, December 9: 7 PM - Haunted by the Present? How the Coming of Jesus Transforms your Present

Wednesday, December 16: 7 PM - Haunted by the Future? How the Coming of Jesus Gives you Hope for the Future

The Lord's Supper will be served at these services.

So, take this brief midweek time either in-person or online to reflect and pray about what this season is about <u>for you</u>.





Imagine kneeling where the shepherds stood at Bethlehem's manger, seeing the places where Jesus grew up and worked, standing in the Jordan River where He was baptized, sailing across the Sea of Galilee where Jesus did most of his ministry, praying in Gethsemane, following along the Way-of-

the-Cross, weeping at Golgotha, or singing hymns of praise at the empty tomb. Walking in the footsteps of Jesus and seeing the land where He lived will change your life forever, and reading the Scriptures will never be the same again.

We are inviting you to take this pilgrimage with us, to experience for yourself the sights, the sounds, and the smells of this historic and beautiful living land. Your understanding of the Bible will be challenged, inspired, and strengthened as the Biblical places we only imagined suddenly come to life. A trip to the Holy Land is truly a journey of epic proportions. There is no other place like it in the whole world. Please consider joining us.

ITINERARY

May 30 - Depart USA

Your spiritual pilgrimage begins as you depart the USA on an overnight flight.

May 31 - Arrive in the Holy Land

You will be welcomed to the Holy Land by our airport representative and transferred to your hotel on the coast.

June 1 – Caesarea Maritima, Megiddo, Sepphoris, Mount Arbel

Begin the day at Caesarea Maritima, the Roman capital of Judea with its theater and Roman Aqueduct, where Cornelius became the first Gentile convert to the new covenant (Acts 10) and Paul was imprisoned before taken to Rome for trial. Travel the ancient caravan route to Tel Megiddo where over 20 cities lie superimposed upon each other and the site of many ancient battles. Visit Sepphoris, the capital of Galilee in Jesus' youth, where Jesus and Joseph probably earned their living as construction workers. End the day's travels on Mount Arbel with its stunning panoramic view of the Plain of Gennesaret and the Sea of Galilee where most of Jesus' ministry took place, before going to our lodging in a kibbutz on the Sea of Galilee.

June 2 - Hazor, Tel Dan, Caesarea Philippi, Golan Heights

Explore Hazor, one of the oldest archaeological sites in Israel. The 3000 year old city was the inspiration for The Source, James Michener's epic historical novel about Israel. Here Joshua fought against Jabin (Joshua 11:1-11). At Tel Dan, see the mud brick arch constructed in Canaanite times and where the "House of David" inscription from the First Temple Period was found. Visit Caesarea Philippi, where Jesus traveled with his disciples and where nearby Peter made his great confession: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God!" (Matthew 16:16) After lunch in the vicinity of Mount Hermon, return through the strategic tableland known as the Golan Heights.

June 3 – Valley of the Wind and Doves, Magdala, Mount of Beatitudes, Eremos Topos, Capernaum, Tabgha, Chorazim, the Ancient Boat, Sea of Galilee Boat Ride

Begin your day walking a portion of the Valley of the Wind and Doves. Continue with a visit to the excavations of Magdala, home of a first century synagogue and Mary Magdalene. Visit the Mount of Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount. Walk down the hill to Eremos Topos, identified by a 3rd Century pilgrim as "the lonely place" where Jesus retired to pray. Explore Capernaum, Jesus' headquarters in Galilee; Tabgha, site of the feeding of the 5000; and Chorazim, the city Jesus cursed because they had seen his mighty acts, yet remained unrepentant. At Nof Ginosar, see the 1st century fishing boat found in the Sea of Galilee's mud, a rare example of the kind of boat in which Jesus would have sailed those waters. End the day with a sunset boat ride on the Sea of Galilee and a worship service on board.

June 4 - Nazareth, Jacob's Well, Baptismal Site, Mount Scopus

You'll visit Nazareth, the boyhood home of Jesus (Matthew 2:23) and the Mount of Precipice where Luke describes how Jesus was rejected by those in his hometown synagogue. Filled with anger they "led him to the brow of the hill whereon their city was built, that they might cast him down headlong." (Luke 4:29) See Sychar, home of Jacob's Well, where Jesus encountered the Samaritan woman (John 4). Remember your baptism as you worship at the Baptismal Site on the River Jordan and contemplate the Baptism of Jesus. You'll approach Jerusalem from Mount Scopus with its panoramic view of the Holy City as you make your way to your hotel.

June 5 – Sunday Worship in Bethlehem, Church of the Nativity, Shepherds' Field

Today we cross the border into Bethlehem, the birthplace of Jesus. Worship in the Christmas Lutheran Church to get a sense of the Christian community of the Holy Land. In the afternoon, visit the Church of the Nativity, the oldest continuously functioning church in the world. See the cave where tradition holds Jesus was born. Look out on the Shepherds' Field, where angels announced his birth, as we close our day with worship.

June 6 – Mount of Olives, Palm Sunday Walk, Garden of Gethsemane, Temple Mount, Southern Wall Excavations, Teaching Steps, Western Wall, Upper Room, Caiaphas' Palace Stand atop the Mount of Olives as Jesus did and enjoy a remarkable view of the "Golden City" of Jerusalem. Walk the route of Jesus' Triumphal Entry on Palm Sunday. Pray in the Garden of Gethsemane. Visit the Temple Mount, site of Solomon's Temple, and the Southern Wall Excavations, with its Teaching Steps. Visit the traditional site of the Last Supper on Mount Zion, and the Church of St. Peter in Gallicantu, the site of the High Priest's Palace, where Jesus stood before the Sanhedrin and was imprisoned overnight before the crucifixion, and where Peter denied that he knew Jesus.

June 7 – Pool of Bethesda, Via Dolorosa, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Garden Tomb, Depart for Home

Begin the day at the Pool of Bethesda, where Jesus performed a Sabbath miracle of healing. Walk the Via Dolorosa, the "Way of the Cross," and stand in reverence at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, site of the crucifixion and tomb of Jesus. Our tour ends with a service of Holy Communion at the Garden Tomb. This evening, you will be transferred to the airport for your return flight to the USA.






