From Your Pastor

We have three baptisms to celebrate in the last 2 months at Grace (one upcoming on Feb. 13.) What a blessing for Grace to witness, to remember our own and to celebrate God's grace on the newest members of His family. In baptism, we are clothed with Christ. All of us, clothed the same. No matter how big or little, young or old, rich or poor. One size fits all.

That makes the church pretty unusual! How often do adults and children wear the same clothing? How often do the rich and poor look alike? How often do the police officer and the nurse wear the same uniform? How often do different personalities and different cultures and different generations have the same clothing? If you ever look at pictures from the 1920s, all the men and all the women looked like they were wearing the same clothing and had the same hair style. That was when unified generations were a thing and it showed! Today, individualism has taken over and "anything goes."

And yet in the church today and joining Christians of all generations, we actually dress the same. There is no difference, St. Paul said, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. We all have the same dirty, disgusting, filthy rags. But Paul goes on to say, we are all also justified freely by His grace through the redemption of Christ Jesus. Christ doesn't leave us in filthy rags. He comes to us and clothes us with Himself and His righteousness sending us forth into the world as kings and queens. He was stripped of his clothes for us.

So is church just a bunch of kids playing dress up? Pretending to be someone we're not? By no means! We return every Sunday from a week of rolling in the dirt. We don't try to hide that fact - we confess it: I, a poor, miserable sinner. And our Father is here to meet us, to wash us clean from our sins, and clothe us with Christ. We aren't dressed like sons and daughters; we ARE sons and daughters of God. And that should change us inwardly in our faith AND outwardly in our deeds.

We are covered with a clothing that God has for us to wear in the wilderness of this world of sin and death, waiting to enter our promised land of heaven. That is clothing that never goes out of style. We don't have to change constantly to match the ever-changing tastes of the world - being clothed with Christ is all we need at Grace and for eternity no matter what you look like today.

So next time you come to church and see people wearing all kinds of clothing in all kinds of colors, some fancy, some not, some new, some old, some you like and some you don't - take another look. See not how we're all different, but all the same. Hear the small voice and the old confessing their sins together, and then hear His forgiveness. And then look around again. And see a church full of Christ. Each and every one the same. Each and every one made new. Each and every one a brother or sister in Christ. Joyous days of repentance and a renewal!



The "*Way of the Cross*" is a deep beautiful devotion that you are invited to this Maundy Thursday. It is rooted in the historic "Stations of the Cross" that developed during the Middle Ages, probably when pilgrims journeyed to the Holy Land marking off the sites associated with our Lord's passion and the journey through Jerusalem to the cross.

This Maundy Thursday, we will take ourselves to the very heart of the suffering of our Lord; the

Passion; his "Via Dolorosa" (the Way of Sorrows); "moving" our worship from the moment of his betrayal until his burial allowing us to better experience the greatest event in history: Christ's death and resurrection, which removed the sins of all people for all time- including ours.


