At times, though we are not a part of this world, we are still living here to be witnesses of Jesus Christ and to bring all to the glory and knowledge of the one true God to all. Sometimes living in this world requires that we need to respond in a Christian manner to things that happen in the news. Last week, government advisors Elon Musk and Michael Flynn accused the "Lutheran" faith of using their "religious status" of laundering money and receiving federal tax dollars for the "operation" of maybe supporting possible illegal immigration activity. They were not specific so it's difficult to respond. Musk and Flynn are referencing Lutheran Social Services.

First and foremost, as a pastor of a Lutheran Church, we are members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and currently do not have direct affiliation with Lutheran Social Services. This is one example of how dangerous blanket assumptions of "grouping" people into the same category is harmful, especially to the local congregation, and this is unfortunate. Assumptions in grouping people together only bring discord and misinformation ironically hurting everyone. There are a wide variety of "Lutheran" synods and non-profit organizations in America that support wonderful programs and controversial programs. While Lutheran Social Services has done some great work in the world regarding humanitarian issues, children and the poor, they have perhaps gone in directions that the LCMS cannot support.

A Lutheran at the end of the day can freely agree with Musk and Flynn that federal tax dollars should not support non-profits; that's fine, but we still must be careful of the impact on our fellow Americans. Churches and non-profits support the people and actually supplement the government in assisting others physically, mentally, and spiritually. While government oversight and spending are current key issues, we as Christians through our giving can choose to support humanitarian issues like assisting refugees but in a moral and legal way. The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod is proud to support and assist legal immigration and those in need like so many refugees seeking a better life.

I appreciate the conversations and the checks and balances to make sure we together as a nation and as Lutherans can support life and bring others the light of Christ. Don't be too worked up on X statements or headlines. Everyone (I hope and pray) is working to make a better world even with different viewpoints. Like Martin Luther, let's put the best construction on everything and be the best Christian we can be to one another. We pray for our nation. We pray for the world. Jesus is Lord of lords and King of kings.


