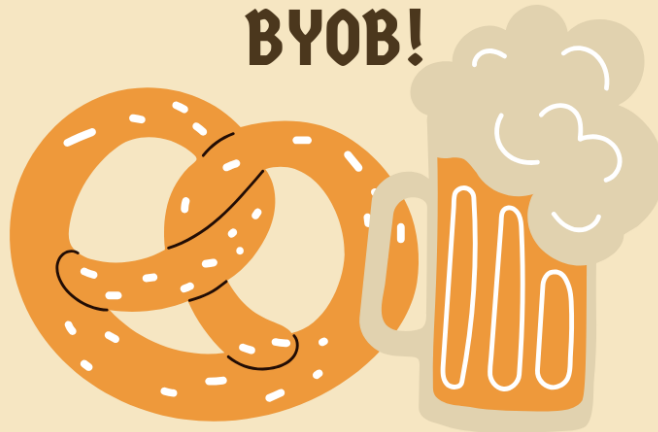

Oktoberfest 2026 Q & A

This is our 5th Oktoberfest in recent years at Grace. This year's Oktoberfest celebration has been scaled back to a simple in-house dinner fundraiser for our members and friends after church on Sunday, September 27.

Why the change this year from our large community Oktoberfest's of previous years?

We are taking a break for a number of reasons: while previous Oktoberfest's have been largely successful seeing 400-500 people, we have sort of outgrown our volunteers. There was certainly a volunteer shortage at Grace that was felt by some of the workers, especially before and after the event, and the burnout was real. And so thank you to all the volunteers we have had in the past! Secondly, the growing expense of the event is making it increasingly difficult to make a decent profit (it's not all about the money, but it certainly is one of the goals in addition to fellowship and community outreach!) Thirdly, there are some local food and beverage licensing and regulations that need some attention which again increases expenses and changes the process in how we handle the different aspects of the event.

Will our large community Oktoberfest return next year?

We hope so! There is great passion for Oktoberfest among many of our members including our pastor. In taking a small break this year with a smaller event, it has motivated some to explore bringing the large event back. If so, strong recruitment of volunteers will be essential and some cost-saving measures and other changes will need to be made to keep the event profitable while retaining good fellowship, outreach and Oktoberfest authenticity.

Where and when is this year's Oktoberfest?

All members and our families and friends are encouraged to attend immediately after church on Sunday, September 27. The event will be held in Foundation Hall with a few pop-up tents and yard games outside. The event will last as long as people are here!

Is there a cost to attend?

No, but we are asking for donations to help raise funds for our kitchen renovation fund. We will also need to keep our Oktoberfest designated fund intact for future Oktoberfest's. Thank you in advance for your support!

BYOB?

Yes! Beer and wine only. After all, it is Oktoberfest! Remember to pack a cooler and share if you like. While the church will not be providing or serving any Lutheran beverages, you are welcome to consume responsibly on your own inside or outside. Prost!

What will return from previous Oktoberfest's?

Our dinner plate will still have our freshly grilled bratwursts, homemade German potato salad and sauerkraut. Dessert, however, will be a bake sale hosted by our LWML. Also, enjoy our Bavarian Pretzels again with cheese dip! We will have our famous photo booth downstairs with Martin Luther. You are welcome to wear your Lederhosen or Dirndl to church that morning. We will play recorded music this year instead of live musicians. Most of all, may our congregation enjoy healthy Christian fellowship in the spirit of Oktoberfest! May God bless us once again.

Greetings Grace Lutheran Church from Camp Dixie!

We were able to spend parts of our summer programs with various campers from some of your congregations and we treasure those moments. We have some truly wonderful Lutheran families in the area, as well as other groups that we get to interface with and minister to.

Retreats: Please share these opportunities with your church members! Camp Dixie is once again running Family Foundations weekends during this retreat season. This is a retreat for children in grades K-8 to experience camp with a grown-up by their side. The retreat for boys is coming up on October 2-4, while the girls retreat is March 5-7. Adult registrations must be same-gendered due to our bunk room lodging. For example, boys in October can bring Dad, Grandpa, Uncle, or another relative/family friend. I am attaching a bulletin announcement and a flyer (one digital version, one printable version) that you can share with your church to spread the word about these retreats.

Bulletin Announcement: Camp Dixie Family Foundations retreats are open for registration! These weekend programs are for grades K-8 accompanied by a same-gendered adult. I also like to share a few words during announcements at the beginning or end of the service so that families can better put a face to the Camp Dixie Director. Other churches have asked me to share about Camp during their adult Bible study so that their congregants can learn more about what we do. I am happy to do any of this, or whatever your church needs during a visit. My family and I have been blessed to make connections with the surrounding churches in this area for the past year and a half that we have been here, and we enjoy worshipping with each local church that we visit.

Chicken Dinner Fundraisers: Our next fundraiser meal is Sunday, Sept 13 from 11am-2pm. \$15 for a full meal supports this outdoors ministry and the Christ-centered programming that we offer.
